- 2. The total assessed value of property differs from last year's total assessed value by 10.24 %
- 3. The tax rate which would levy the same amount of property taxes as last year, when multiplied by the new total assessed value of property, would be \$.247389 per \$100 of assessed value.
- 4. Seward County proposes to adopt a property tax request that will cause its tax rate to be \$.261794 per \$100 of assessed value.
- 5. Based on the proposed property tax request and changes in other revenue, the total operating budget of Seward County will DECREASE last year's budget by 4%
- 6. A copy of this resolution be certified and forwarded to the County Clerk on or before October 15, 2025.
